(Clipping from newspaper for December 14, 1916, entitled "Will Oswald Kills An Eagle Near Potter" is here quoted.)

"Will Oswald shot and killed a gray eagle at his farm north of Potter Sunday, that measured $6\frac{1}{2}$ feet from tip to tip, and the bird has been on exhibition in Potter this week. Eagles are very rare in this section of the country now, although in the early days they were quite common. One was killed at Winchester about a year ago. Until a few years ago a pair of bald eagles made their home on Dan Greiner's farm on Walnut creek but they finally disappeared and it was never learned what became of them.

"On Oct. 26, 1873. W. R. Laswell killed a gray eagle in Platte County, Mo., across the river from here, that measured $6\frac{1}{2}$ feet from tip to tip. On Nov. 25, 1875, Collins B. Hodges killed one in the same county of the same measurements. On March 20, 1881, John I. Skillman killed a bald eagle in that county that measured 7 feet. A. A. Miller killed one in the same county in May, 1895, and on Jan. 18, 1897, John Reed killed a bald eagle that measured $7\frac{1}{2}$ feet.

"Prince Maximillian, on his trip up the Missouri river in 1833, saw white-headed eagles nesting frequently on high trees along the shore in this region. Audubon, the naturalist, in 1843, discovered nests of the same species of eagle, in the river bluffs, east of here. Dr. Hoy also mentions them in his list of birds of this region in 1854. Major Joseph Todd, who settled opposite Fort Leavenworth in 1835, says that bald eagles were common here then.

"Eagle Springs, a well known Doniphan county resort, was so named because eagles frequented the bluffs in that vicinity in the early days. Pryor Plank, former proprietor of Eagle Springs, told the writer that they once had a domesticated eagle at the place. It developed a fondness for chicken equal to that of a Methodist circuit rider, and "for this and other little idiosncrasies," said Mr. Plank, 'we tried to shoo him off the place, but he refused to be shooed, so we got a friend to take him away and he became a wanderer over the country, with headquarters in the court house park at Troy. Joe Schlitzbaum, a former

county clerk, fed him on wolf pups that were brought in for the bounty. He finally disappeared after cleaning up all the stray cats around town and incurring the displeasure of chicken raisers generally."
